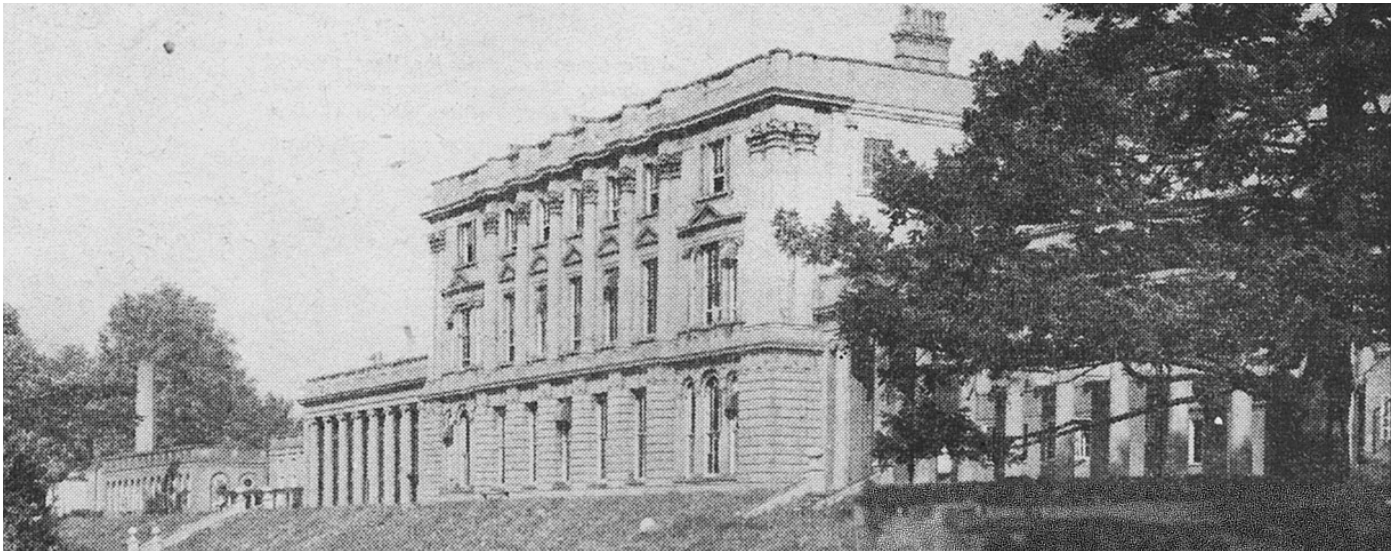

First recorded in the Domesday Book, Caversham Park on the north bank of the Thames has played a central role in history for nearly a millennium. The estate became a refuge in the WW1 and was taken over by the BBC during WW2. It became a centre for intelligence throughout the Second World War, the Cold War and the 'War on Terror'.
