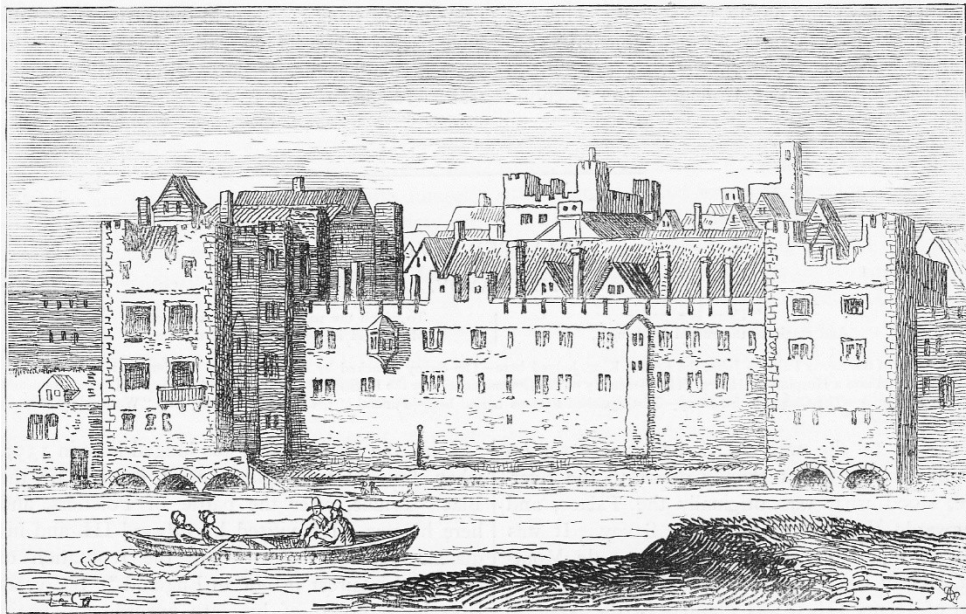

David takes us from the early history of army medicine through to the present day. The impact of weapons technology on combat injuries forced the evolution of military medicine technology. Such changes occurred over the centuries, but it was during the English Civil War when Oliver Cromwell with the Model Army repurposed a building to create the Savoy Hospital in 1642.
